Testing ABCs ... Attendance, Breakfast, Confidence, Sleep

Attendance – Students need to be present and prompt everyday. Students are more comfortable taking tests with their classmates as opposed to on their own during a make-up session.

Breakfast – A healthy breakfast will maintain a student's energy level throughout the morning. Research has shown that a breakfast high in fiber, protein, and fruit/juice stimulates brain activity.

Confidence – "If you think you can, you're right." Students have been working hard all year and should feel confident about their ability. Students should want to do well on tests and should always try their best, but they should never be stressed out.

Sleep – The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends ten hours of sleep per night for school aged children. Get a good night sleep every night but especially a night before an important test.
