

INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS – File 9.8.5Academic Requirements for Student Athletes - Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association

A student must secure during the last marking period preceding the contest a passing grade in at least 20 periods of prepared work. Prepared work is defined as any subject or course in which credit is allowed toward the high school diploma. A student cannot at any time represent a school unless that student is taking at least 20 periods of prepared work. To be eligible for the fall marking period, students are required to have final passing grades for the year in the required number of periods of prepared work. The academic eligibility of all students shall be considered as official and determining only on the date when the report cards for that *ranking period* have been issued.
